### Platforms

- **Competition Portal** The competition portal will be linked through our website. Through the portal, participants will obtain the information they need to compete.
- **Technology Fluency Institute** Objective testing is conducted through Technology Fluency Institute (TFI). Advisers will receive an email with their login and password to retrieve logins and passwords for all students. After the winners are announced, advisers can login to see student scores and how students performed on the competencies for each event.

### Guidelines for Virtual

- Due to our virtual environment, proctors are not required for objective testing; however, each student will be asked to complete the Honor Code document.
- Objective tests are taken individually, and the scores will be averaged.
- Ranking for winners are based on test scores.
- Role play scenario prompts will be posted for participants. To be eligible to compete, participants review the scenario and create video submissions and upload to the Competition



Portal. Videos collected will be returned to chapters/regions to use to conduct their own feedback sessions/mock judging activities at the local chapter level as they see fit.

- Role Play participants should review the role play scenario prompt and prepare their role play presentation within the prep time indicated in the national guidelines. After prep time is complete, it is recommended that the participant only film their presentation once to simulate the impromptu format of the events. After the video recording is complete, upload the video to the Competition Portal.
